WYGGESTONS: OUR HERITAGE

William Wyggeston, former MP and mayor of Leicester city, founded the original Wyggeston's hospital in 1513 to give accommodation to 'twelve poor men and twelve poor women', as a practical expression of his Philanthropic faith.

Today, over 500 years later, the modern-day Wyggestons remains committed to providing comfort, care and wellbeing for its residents in a safe and secure environment through sheltered accommodation at William House and residential care at Agnes House. William House has evolved over its long and interesting history, starting life next door to the parish church of St Martin in Leicester city centre (now the Cathedral), before residents moved to a new building on Fosse Road.

This building was replaced with the current William House. Agnes House was purpose-built in 1992 to provide residential care.

Our on site chapel, is always open and apart from regular services offers a tranquil setting for moments of quiet reflection. St Ursula's houses stained glass and stone monuments from both the first and second hospital buildings.

At Wyggestons we are proud to build on our past, while bringing the principles of care and hospitality into the modern day.



AGNES HOUSE: RESIDENTIAL CARE

Agnes House accommodates 26 residents on a long term or respite basis offering the very highest standards of care to all. Each bedroom is single occupancy with en-suite facilities, television point and a 24 hour call system. Our spacious, sunny dining room offers a relaxing place to enjoy meals, with a good choice of menu and we can cater for individual dietary requirements.

Set in five picturesque acres, Agnes House offers safety in a secure environment. As well as providing optimum levels of individual care and attention we foster independence and trust in all our residents.







The underlying principle we work to at Wyggestons, is that a residential home should be foremost a home, where a loved family member feels happy, safe and at ease. Residents are encouraged to maintain their independence by making their own decisions and where possible retaining links with the wider community, at the same time being supported with excellent staffing levels. We have a full and varied programme of activities for all interests in which we welcome all residents to participate.








Visitors are always welcome, and our large, comfortable sitting room offer access onto a patio area with wonderful views of the grounds. These landscaped gardens feature pathways that are suitable for wheelchairs, quiet seating areas, a fish pond and a pretty summer house. In keeping with the founder's aims for Wyggestons, St Ursula's Chapel is home to both regular and special services which are taken by our resident minister.

At Agnes House, health professionals visit individual residents to meet their personal needs. On site there is a well-stocked Library, computers offering internet access and Skype, a cinema room showing old and new favourites, a hairdressing salon and we can also offer overnight accommodation to visiting family and friends.
